given to an article that furthers the understanding of the history of working people. Articles focused on historical events AND articles about current issues (work, housing, organizing, health, education) that include historical context are both welcome. The work should be published -- in print or online -- in a union or workers' center publication or by an independent/free-lance journalist.



The 2016 prize went to Chloe Kent for "The Women of New York's Bravest," in Enchantress magazine May 2016.
