THE BERNHARDT PRIZE is an award of \$500

given to an article that furthers the understanding of the history of working people. Articles focused on historical events AND articles about current issues (work, housing, organizing, health, education) that include historical context are both welcome. The work should be published -- in print or online -- in a union or workers' center publication or by an independent/free-lance journalist.



The 2017 prize went to Garret Keizer for "Labor's Schoolhouse, Lessons from the Paterson Silk Strike of 1913," in Harper's Magazine July, 2017.
