

INTRODUCING THE NYLHA AND EWOC/NYC BOOK CLUB

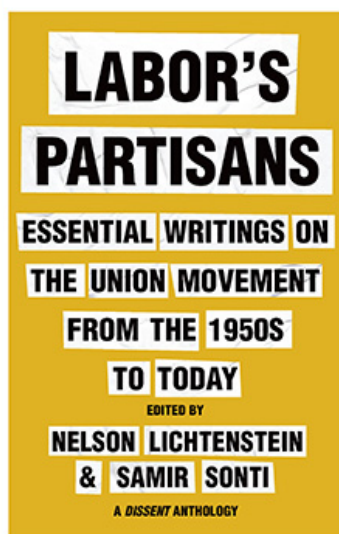
The New York Labor History Association and the Emergency Workplace Organizing Committee NYC have joined together to form a book club. The book club will provide an opportunity for a diverse group from both organizations, that may include, labor historians, teachers, seasoned trade unionists, and new labor activists and organizers to learn, discuss, and connect over the history of labor organizing in New York and beyond.

Summary and Material:

The book club will begin Sunday, March 2nd at 1:00 PM in a hybrid format (in-person and Zoom), pending location scouting. We will discuss further books and schedules at the first meeting as a group.

The reading group will focus on historical topics relevant to challenges of current day union organizing and engage in discussions between members of the the NYLHA and EWOC-NYC to help guide their members and supporters to develop their organizing knowledge and skills.

For the first meeting, we'll be reading Labor's Partisans, a new collection of essays edited by Nelson Lichtenstein and Samir Sonti; 2025 by Dissent; The New Press.



Further selected readings will be centered on more specific topics we pick as a group that could include 1) class struggle and solidarity; 2) changing labor law; 3) New York City local organizing; and 4) labor and queerness. Depending on interest from the group, guest facilitators, there may be limited supplemental readings as well.

Members:

This group is open to all NYLHA and EWOC-NYC members. We especially welcome members who are newer to labor history and labor organizing. No previous knowledge or reading about trade unionism is required.
